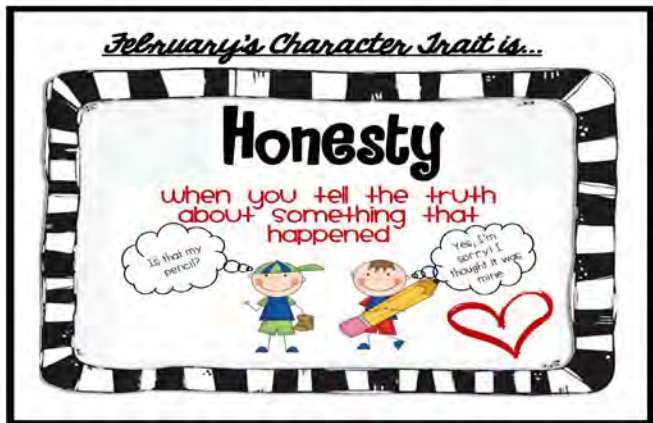

Here are some tips to think about when creating routines.

- Have a set time for bedtime
- Have a set time to wake each morning
- Have clothes and school bag ready the night before
- Make lunches the night before
- Have set times for starting and ending breakfast
- Set a time each day for homework. Try straight after school with limited electronics to concentrate. Give student(s) time to enjoy other activities and/or relax the rest of the night

- Give your student(s) lots of positive encouragement and acknowledge their hard work

Registration Information for 2020-2021 School Year

On-line Registration begins for current Early Childhood – 12th grade students on Friday, March 20, 2020 and is due no later than Friday, April 10, 2020.

Registration fees are due at the time of registration.

Please register your student online through the SKYWARD parent portal. If you have difficulties logging in please contact the school office via phone at 847-464-6014 or email Ms. Dawn Rau, Administrative Assistant at dawn.rau@central301.net.

If you have a student that will be entering Kindergarten in the fall and you have been through the registration process in the past, including the early childhood program, here are the following options:

Attend Kindergarten Registration Day:

Friday, February 28, 2020 at Prairie View from 8:00 am – 3:00 pm

OR

Send in the initial registration forms found at this link for your current student. Please be sure to download the forms for 2020-2021 school year. We will need you to bring in the original birth certificate to be copied for your students file.

If you already have a student in grades EC – 12th grade and you currently own your residence, you will not be required to prove residency again for your 2020-2021 Kindergarten student. Those families that rent or are hosted will be required to complete the residency paperwork again starting on Friday, May 1, 2020. Those students who have not completed the residency process by the start of school will be excluded.

Contain your germs

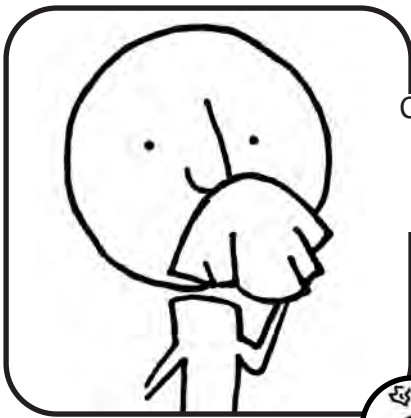
Stay home if you have the flu. If you have fever or chills AND a cough, or sore throat tell your teacher or school nurse.

2 Rhymes It's Groundhog Day! Read <i>Grumpy Groundhog</i> by Maureen Wright together.	3 Play Get out an old board game. Have your child invent new rules for the game, and then play it according to the new rules.	4 Reading At breakfast, help your child read the cereal box or another food container together.	5 Writing It's National Weatherperson's Day. Have your child draw a weather forecast for tomorrow in pictures.	6 Sounds Ask your child what her favorite sound is and why. Then, share your favorite sound.	7 Writing It's National Send a Card to a Friend Day. Have your child make a card out of construction paper to give to a friend or family member.	8 Songs On National Kite Flying Day, sing "Let's Go Fly a Kite" from Disney's original <i>Mary Poppins</i> .
9 Science It's National Pizza Day. Make a pizza together, and talk about what happens to it as it bakes in the oven.	10 Rhymes How many words can your child think of that rhyme with the word "heart"?	11 Songs On National Make a Friend Day, make up a song about friendship and sing it to the tune of "Old MacDonald Had a Farm."	12 Stories Look at family pictures, and have your child tell you stories about what happened when each picture was taken.	13 Writing Make valentines for each other by cutting out paper hearts and writing kind words or drawing pictures on them.	14 Reading Happy Valentine's Day! Read <i>Valensteins</i> by Ethan Long together.	15 Play Find items around the house to use as musical instruments, and start a band.
16 Sounds Take turns making animal sounds and guessing the animal.	17 Stories Celebrate Random Acts of Kindness Day by telling your child a story about a time someone went out of his or her way to be kind to you.	18 Math Have your child sort candy hearts into piles by color.	19 Songs While helping your child get dressed, make up a silly song to sing together.	20 Play It's National Love Your Pet Day. Have your child pretend he is a veterinarian and give his pet (either real or a stuffed animal) an imaginary checkup.	21 Science Go outside and help your child choose nature items, such as leaves and pine cones. Glue them to the inside of a shoebox lid for a nature shadow box.	22 Rhymes With tape or chalk, create a hopscotch game. Put a picture in each square. Call out a word, and have your child hop to the square with the rhyming word.
23 Reading Read <i>The Day It Rained Hearts</i> by Felicia Bond together.	24 Math Have your child go around the house and count all of the blue objects she can find.	25 Science Mix 2 tsp. baking soda with 1 cup water in a tall glass. Add several 1-inch pieces of spaghetti and 5 tsp. of vinegar. Watch what happens!	26 Stories It's National Tell a Fairy Tale Day. Read a favorite fairy tale together, and then make up your own version of it.	27 Writing It's National Polar Bear Day. Have your child draw a picture of a polar bear and give his bear a name. Help him write the name on the paper.	28 Sounds On National Tooth Fairy Day, ask your child how many words she can think of that have the same beginning sound as "tooth."	29 Math It's Leap Day! Explain to your child why this February is different than last February. How many more days are there this month?
